WACO HOSTING MAJOR EVENTS IN SEPTEMBER!

WACO, Texas - The Waco Convention & Visitors Bureau is proud to host numerous sporting and religious events in Waco during the month of September.

The National Skeet Shooting Association will hold their US Open at the Waco Skeet and Trap Club September 8-11, with an expected attendance of 350 participants. On September 10, the Texas Junior Golf Tournament will hold their Bear Country Mini-Tour Major Banquet in the McLennan Hall of the Waco Convention Center. This event is expected to bring in 400 attendees.

Also taking place is the Fuddruckers All Star Weekend September 30-October 1, with the Softball Showcase being held at Getterman Stadium and the Baseball Showcase occurring at the Baylor Ball Park. This tournament includes four selected teams of All Stars from the Texas and New Mexico Junior Colleges and gives the players an opportunity to showcase their talents for coaches and scouts. This event is expected to bring in around 500 visitors to Waco.

The 27th annual Wild West Century Bike Ride will take place September 17 with almost 1,000 participants at this event. Information for this event can be found on the story ideas page attached with this e-mail.

The Antioch Community Church will hold their World Mandate Conference at Baylor's Ferrell Center and the Waco Convention Center September 16-18, with an expected attendance of 350 members. On

September 26-30, AME will host their 10th Episcopal District Annual Conference at the Waco Convention Center. The expected attendance at this event is 600 participants.
