

Attention!

Beginning September 1, 2014 it will become illegal to park certain types of vehicles on a street, alley or public right-of-way in a residential district.

Some of the prohibited types of vehicles are:

- 1. Commercial vehicle**
- 2. Trailer**
- 3. Boat trailer**
- 4. Truck Tractor**
- 5. House Trailer**
- 6. Motor Home**
- 7. Oversize vehicle**
- 8. Boat**
- 9. Semi-trailer**
- 10. Pole Trailer**
- 11. Farm Tractor**
- 12. 2-ton truck (or larger)**



FAQ –

Q. How do I know if I am in a residential district?

Q. Can I legally park my RV in front of my house to load and unload for a trip?

A. The City Ordinance allows for loading, unloading and prepping for storage for no more than 24 hours.

Q. I own a commercial delivery service. Are my drivers going to be ticketed if making a delivery?

A. No. Vehicles in the act of loading or unloading passengers, freight, or merchandise may temporarily park.

Q. I am a plumber. Can I park my van in front of my customer's house while I'm working?

A. A vehicle being used by a contractor can park their vehicle while conducting work from 7a-10p.

Q. My work truck broke down. Can I leave it on the street until I get it repaired?

A. You can only leave a vehicle that is disabled long enough to make emergency repairs. Usually this means the time that it would take for a wrecker to respond.
