Storm Update #3 as of 12 Noon Saturday, October 4th

Form the Emergency Operations Center:

As of 12 Noon this morning, here are reports presented by various City departments to the Emergency Operation Center:

Power: Oncor is down to about 1400 customers without power in Waco. They have more outside crews arriving now. They do not have an estimated time on total completion but they have been working with priorities given to traffic signals and commercial operations with refrigeration needs.

Code Enforcement:

Code Enforcement has finished their assessments and the damages are as follow:

- 39 Residential homes with damage
- 11 Multi-Family residents with damage
- 49 Commercial buildings with damage
- 2 Non-Profit locations with damage
- 1 Church with damage

Traffic:

As of 10-04-10 the following signals are not in operation as of 11:09 AM.

- Valley Mills & New Road , due to no power restored.
- Sanger & Towne Oaks , due to no power restored.
- Sanger & Lake Air, due to no power restored.
- Valley Mills & Lake Air , currently working on now.
- Valley Mills & Wooded Acers, is in line next to be work on.

As of 10-04-14 the following signal repairs have been made and are in operation as of 11:09 AM.

- Valley Mills & Sanger Ave repositioned twisted signal are and reinstalled signal heads and repaired electrical.

Solid Waste:

Solid Waste and Parks crews are responding to the square area bounded by Edmond Drive, Richland Drive, Sanger Avenue and 59th Street. We have encountered very heavy brush and downed trees.

Parks and Solid Waste crews are continuing in the same area as before. Downed trees and limbs are being collected with 5 brush trucks and cut crews.

Solid Waste commercial operations have reached out to restaurants and food establishments that have been without power or phone service. We have assigned a unit for spoiled food waste collection.

We estimate we have already hauled over 200,000 pounds of debris trees as of noon with double or more expected by end of day.

VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster)

Red Cross and Salvation Army and Caritas are working with individuals impacted by damaged apartment complexes and other areas.

SAFETY NOTE: Please encourage ALL motorists to approach intersections with extreme caution even if the signal is working. Until such time as all intersections can be fully checked and adjusted, they may not be functioning perfectly.
