American Rescue Plan Act

- \$1.9 Trillion Act signed into law March 11, 2021
- Provides \$350 billion to eligible state, local, territorial and tribal governments to respond to the COVID-19 emergency and bring back jobs
 - The City of Waco allocation is \$34,720,687
- Local governments funding is separated into two tranches one 60 days after the law signed and the second a year later
 - The City of Waco has received the first \$17,360,343.50

American Rescue Plan Act

Four Categories of Eligible Uses

- 1. Responding to the public health emergency and its negative economic impacts
- 2. Providing premium pay to eligible workers
- 3. Providing government services (revenue loss)
- To make necessary investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure

Prohibited Uses

- Deposits into Pension Funds
- As a non-federal match for federal programs that bar the use

American Rescue Plan Act

Period of Performance

- Costs must be incurred between March 3, 2021 to December 31, 2024
 - Incurred is proposed to be defined as being obligated by December 31, 2024 with spending being allowed through December 31, 2026

Reporting

- One interim report through July 31, 2021
- Quarterly Project and Expenditure reports through December 31, 2026

American Rescue Plan Act - City Steps

- Interim Final Rule issued in May clarifying usage of funding however will not be finalized until July or August
- Budget amendment in next month to establish a separate fund to account, track, and ensure compliance with funding
- Brainstorming ideas for usage of funds and establishing allocation buckets (e.x. City uses, Assistance to Households, Small business assistance, Contingency, etc.)
- Citizen engagement and community assessment
- Calculating any revenue loss experienced by the City
- A proposal will be prepared and submitted to Council
