


Heart Of Texas Homeless Coalition (HOTHC)

- Shelter Operations:
 - ≻ Mission Waco \$112,070
 - Salvation Army \$119,070
- Isolation and Quarantine:
 - ➢ Hotel Accommodations for rooms \$10,500
 - (10 assisted to date)
- Rental Assistance:
 - Economic Opportunity Advancement Center \$378,000

Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grant

What is the YHDP Grant?

- Two-year initial grant
 - Potentially renewed annually thereafter
- Serves unaccompanied youth
 - Under the age of 25
 - Includes pregnant and parenting youth
- HOTHC awarded \$2.23 million in 2019

How does YHDP work?

- Selected communities create local plan
 - Assesses needs of youth
 - Demonstrates how funding used to end youth homelessness
- Communities run local competition for projects

YHDP

- YHDP funded at \$2.23 million for 2 years
- Projects selected in RFP:
 - Youth Drop-in Center Transitional Housing
 - Heart to Home Youth
 Navigation Team
- Rapid Rehousing Plus
- Planning

Role of the City of Waco in YHDP

- Continuum of Care (CoC) Administrator acting as a YHDP project manager
- Matching Funds: \$2,500
- Signature of support
 - City Manager
