



Entitlement Grants

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

Used for a wide range of community development needs.

- Allocation: \$1,433,855
- Administration Cap 20%: \$286,771
- Public Service Cap 15%: \$215,078
- Net Available: \$932,006

HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)

Used to create affordable housing for low-income households

- Allocation: \$700,789
- Administration Cap 10%: \$70,079
- Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO)15% Allocation: \$105,118
- Net Available: \$525,592

Meeting National Objectives & Eligibility CDBG: Community Development Block Grant

Eligibility Requirements:

- Benefit low to moderate income
- Prevent slums or blight
- Address urgent community needs
- Used for eligible spending activities
- Not less than 70% of spending must benefit low to moderate income persons

Eligible Activities:

- Administration: 20% Cap
- Public Services: 15% Cap
- Housing Rehabilitation
- Homeownership Assistance
- Public Facilities & Improvements (Parks)
- Blight removal/demolition
- Code Enforcement
- Acquisition/disposition of real property
- Economic Development


