Background

- Started operations in 1968
- Established as the Local Mental Health Authority for the 6 county region

Housing and Homelessness with MHMR

- 2004- PATH established- SAMSHA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration) grant to provide outreach and engagement for homeless individuals
- ▶ 2006- First HUD (Housing and Urban Development) grant
- 2009- Expanded HUD grant
- 2014- Established TBRA (Tenant Based Rental Assistance) program with City
- 2016- Established Rapid rehousing grant with HUD
- 2016- Established Housing Navigator program with HUD
- 2017- Established Landlord Liaison program
- ▶ 2019- Supportive Housing Resource program
- 2020- YHDP (Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program) expansion
- ▶ 2020- FLASH program

PATH

Projects for the Assistance and Transition from Homelessness

- 2 Case Managers, Habilitation Specialist and a supervisor provides outreach, engagement and case management services for homeless individuals not connected with resources
- Serves around 250 individuals annually
- Primary focus is to connect individuals with mainstream resources and eventually housing
- \$162,000 from SAMHSA annually

Permanent Supportive Housing

- Homeless and disabled individuals
- ► 157 total individuals served (currently 45)
- Meant to be for our most vulnerable homeless individuals. Many stay in the program for years
- Receive \$288,000 annually (HUD)

Rapid Rehousing

- Can be as little as deposit assistance, or rental assistance up to 2 years.
- Typical duration is 6 months to a year
- ► Meant to serve less vulnerable homeless individuals
- 93 individuals served (18 currently)
- Receive \$87,000 annually (HUD)

TBRA Tenant Based Rental Assistance

- Has served 232 individuals in 144 households in the Waco area
- Average household cost under \$600 per month
- ► Sharp reductions in Emergency Department visits
- ► Increase in establishment of Primary Care Physicians
- 24 months of assistance
- ► Receive around \$100,000 annually (City of Waco)

Supported Housing Resource program

- Eviction prevention focused
- Can provide up to 12 months of assistance
- Also focuses on individuals discharging from state mental health facilities
- Receive \$97,000 annually (Health and Human Services Commission)

Landlord Liaison Program

- Provides landlords with incentive to rent to individuals with low income, eviction histories and/or criminal backgrounds
- Reimburses landlords for negative outcomes to lease
- 40 individuals served, 10 landlords have requested reimbursement
- Funded with \$20,000 from Cooper Foundation, \$10,300 of funds have been dispersed

FLASH Program

Flexible
Assistance to
Secure Housing

- Funded by Homeless Coalition
- Provides funding for unique barriers to housing not typically covered by other agencies and grants
 - Birth Certificates & IDs (40 served)
 - Bus Passes (5 served)
 - Renter's insurance (1 served)

Housing Navigator Program

- 2 Case Managers
- Seeks to overcome barriers for individuals searching for housing
- Pays for application fees, utility deposits and move in groceries
- Served 149 individuals last year
- Receive \$175,000 annually (HUD)
