

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

Used for a wide range of community development needs

- Allocation: \$1,384,540
- Administration Cap 20%: \$276,908
- Public Service Cap 15%: \$207,681
 - \$120,072 recommended allocation
- Net Available: \$987,560


Meeting National Objectives & Eligibility CDBG: Community Development Block Grant

Eligibility Requirements:

- Benefit low to moderate income
- Prevent slums or blight
- Address urgent community needs
- Used for eligible spending activities
- Not less than 70% of spending must benefit low to moderate income persons

Eligible Activities:

- Administration: 20% Cap
- Public Services: 15% Cap
- Housing Rehabilitation
- Homeownership Assistance
- Public Facilities & Improvements (Parks)
- Blight removal/demolition
- Code Enforcement
- Acquisition/disposition of real property
- Economic Development

Used to create affordable housing for low-income households



HOME Program Eligible Activities

- Administration 10% Cap
- Homeownership (Construction and Rehabilitation)
- Rental (Construction and Rehabilitation)
- CHDO 15% Cap

- Down payment & closing cost assistance
- Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)
- Acquisition of vacant land
- Demolition that results in new HOME assisted affordable housing united being created
