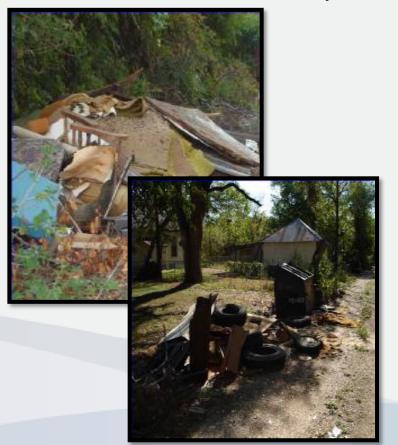

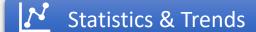

Program Goals



Alley & Illegal Dumping Program

- Frequency
 - Year 1 Service all alleys once
 - Year 2 and forward Service all alleys 2-3 times per year
 - Illegal dumping response time 3 business days upon investigation completion
- Scheduling time spent in districts
 - Year 1 Equal amount of time in Districts 1, 2, and 4
 - Year 2 and forward Proportional amount of time per district
- Increase efforts to abandon alleys to citizens
 - Challenges to be addressed:
 - Methodology (Legal; Operational)
 - Records
 - Inventory/Rating/Priority
 - Fence removal costs
 - Increased maintenance cost and taxes for citizens
- Track, monitor, and report to create transparency and accountability

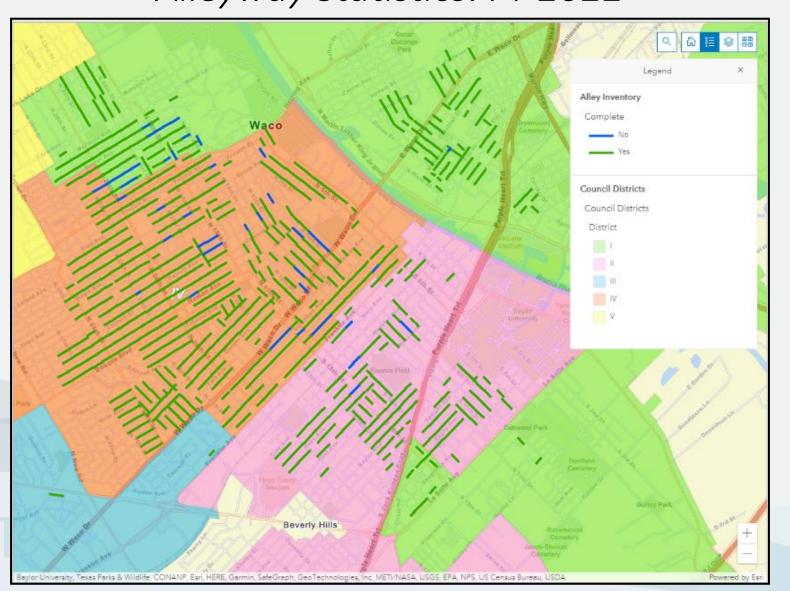
