




PATIENTS BY AGE






PATIENTS BY INCOME






PATIENTS BY RACE






PATIENTS BY PAYOR TYPE









- Site grading is underway for mid-February completion
- Drilling of piers: last week of February
- To date, over 70% of contract dollars from Beck awarded to local participation
- Materials market seems to be leveling out



FINANCE: Establish financial plans to build capacity and mitigate risk

ACCESS: Ensure patient access to WFM's integrated primary care services within the established service area

EQUITY: Promote equity in all functions of the organization

STRATEGIC PLAN



ADVANCEMENT: Develop tools & resources that support the mission of WFM through grants, contributions, and stewardship of community partnerships and public relations

CLINICAL: Design, implement, and measure clinic systems that improve health equity adopt best practices for integration, measure satisfaction & quality, and deliver value-based care

FISCAL CHALLENGES



- Texas FQHCs excluded from 1115 Waiver funds
- 15% more uninsured compared with national average
- Aggressive inflation / supplies, equipment, staffing
- End of supplemental federal COVID grant dollars
- PHE ending: drop off in Medicaid and no reimbursement for uninsured COVID visits
