

#### **CASPER**

#### **CASPER Tool Kit**

- Published By CDC
- 30 Clusters of 7 household Interviews
  - Cluster non overlapping section in a geographic area with a known number of households
  - 30 clusters x 7 interviews = n-210
- For the results to be descriptive of the sampling area a minimum of 80% completion is required.
  - 210\*80%= n-168

#### **CASPER-Modified**


#### McLennan County

- Stage 1
  - Join urban and rural tracts to ensure at least 25 households
- Stage 2
  - 16 Urban clusters randomly selected
  - 14 Rural clusters randomly selected
- Stage 3
  - Random sampling (every 7<sup>th</sup> house)

Goal 210

Actual 185

Completion Rate 88%



## **Community Survey**

#### Individual Level Data

- November 2023 January 2024
- Online and Paper
- English and Spanish
- 25 questions
- Distribution
  - Media
  - Physical
  - Convenience Sampling

## **Community Survey**

#### Statistically Significant population

- 95% Confidence Interval
- 5% Margin of Error
  - 384 responses needed for statistically significant sample population for a population of 263,115 (McLennan County)

#### McLennan County

- 653 responses
- 495 in McLennan County

## **Focus Groups**

#### Qualitative data collection

- Cannot be counted, measured or easily expressed using numbers
- No standardized sample size validation (Trotter, 2012)
  - Interview to redundancy or saturation
- 6 Focus Groups
  - 4 English
  - 2 Spanish

Drug Abuse	"Drugs, the crime and in daytime. Now I'm thinking about thatwas just as bad."

Lack of Access to Care	"We have resources. We have the Good Health Card. We have Indigent Health Care. We have the marketplace, but the problem is in reaching the people in a way that they know how to utilize these programs."	
Mental Health	"The pandemic has exacerbated existing mental health conditions and led to higher incidence of new disorders among pre-morbid individuals."




