
Study of the China Spring Area sewer basin completed in 2019

- Growth is exceeding capacity
- Need to preserve capacity in the East Bank interceptor
 - Upsizing the interceptor along the Brazos River would be expensive & disruptive
- Reclaim water re-use feasibility favorable
- Determining a site for a wastewater treatment plant allows for proper planning
- Public Meeting was held at China Spring ISD Administration Building on September 5,
 2019 to discuss the need for a future wastewater treatment plant



Determined the optimal area for a wastewater plant


Reviewed properties currently for sale – none have met the requirements

Soft inquiries made on several properties in optimal area – 1 owner expressed interest


Evaluated TCEQ permit implications

- Property owners 1 mile from the effluent would have standing
 - Measured from discharge structure
 - 1 mile from middle of Brazos River
 - Properties directly adjacent






NORTH BRAZOS RIVER PROPERTY










Treatment Process Planned for Buster Chatham Site.






FAQs

- Does City intend to Annex private property?
 - No. Only city owned property will be annexed. Private property can only be annexed voluntarily.
- How will the City control any odor?
 - The City will employ the latest technology for odor control.
- How will the City light the property?
 - The City will utilize down cast lighting to reduce light pollution and smart lighting to limit the total amount of lights.
- Is there a way to limit any noise?
 - The City will utilize the latest technology in sound reduction.

FAQs cont.

- How many trucks will there be daily?
 - Bull Hide Creek WWTP has two operators with pickups daily, and approximately 3 times a week, a haul truck will take solid waste to the Central WWTP. Occasionally supplies will be delivered.
 - We would expect a similar amount of traffic at the North Brazos Plant
- How will the City screen the plant from the public?
 - The City may place a berm around the plant.
 - The City may plant screening vegetation bushes and trees along the fence line of the property.
 - The City may continue to lease (as we do at Bull Hide WWTP) property out for hay or other crop production.
