The current Waco flag in front of City Hall was designed by Mr. Gwen Stewart, the original department chair of the TSTI Commercial Art & Advertising program. Mr. Stewart's design of the Suspension Bridge was selected from hundreds of entries for a flag representing the City of Waco in 1985.

FIVE PRINCIPLES OF GOOD FLAG DESIGN



Keep It Simple.

The flag should be so simple that a child can draw it from memory.

Use Meaningful Symbolism.

The flag's images, colors, or patterns should relate to what it symbolizes.

Use 2 or 3 Basic Colors.

Limit the number of colors on the flag to three which contrast well and come from the standard color set.

No Lettering or Seals.

Never use writing of any kind or an organization's seal.

Be Distinctive or Be Related.

Avoid duplicating other flags but use similarities to show connections.

EMBRACING SYMBOLS

For flags to work well, they need their symbolism to be simple and bold, capable of expression from a distance.

The Flying W is an iconic mark for Wacoans.

The Bosque and Brazos Rivers are simply represented with parallel lines.
