## FLAG HISTORY

The current Waco flag in front of City Hall was designed by Mr. Gwen Stewart, the original department chair of the TSTI Commercial Art \& Advertising program. Mr. Stewart's design of the Suspension Bridge was selected from hundreds of entries for a flag representing the City of Waco in 1985.


## FIVE PRINCIPLES OF GOOD FLAG DESIGN

## Keep It Simple.

The flag should be so simple that a child can draw it from memory

## Use Meaningful Symbolism.

The flag's images, colors, or patterns should relate to what it symbolizes.

## Use 2 or 3 Basic Colors.

Limit the number of colors on the flag to three which contrast well and come from the standard color set.

## No Lettering or Seals.

Never use writing of any kind or an organization's seal.

## Be Distinctive or Be Related.

Avoid duplicating other flags but use similarities to show connections.

## EMBRACING SYMBOLS

For flags to work well, they need their symbolism to be simple and bold, capable of expression from a distance.

The Flying W is an iconic mark for Wacoans.
The Bosque and Brazos Rivers are simply represented with parallel lines.
