WACO WONDERLAND

- Signature holiday festival launched in 2013 by the City of Waco, City Center Waco, and Waco Public Improvement District Number One to enhance the tree lighting ceremony, showcase downtown Waco, and boost economic impact
- Funded by the PID, community sponsors and City of Waco in-kind staffing support
- Collaboration between city departments to produce and execute event logistics and operations
- Estimated weekend attendance of 25,000
- Average revenue stream of \$80k from ticket sales and merchant booths






2023 VISITOR DATA

DOWNTOWN LIGHTS

- City Center Waco and Waco Public Improvement District Number One coordinate the installation of the downtown holiday lights, décor, and photo opportunities
- Locations include Heritage Square, Bridge Street Plaza, City Hall, and Convention Center
- Contract established in 2020 between Waco Public Improvement District Number One and Sherrariums Company for the installation, removal, shipping, and storage
- 2023 expenditures were \$73.7K
- Installation week of November 18 and removal week of January 8

WILD LIGHTS AT CAMERON PARK ZOO

- Established in 2021 as revenue-generating event to showcase the zoo during the holidays
- More than 3 million lights, 65 displays and two tunnels along the zoo's inner loop
- Open to the public on select nights from November 29 – December 31
- 15,500 attendees in 2023
- Includes visits with Santa, activities for kids, and food and beverage options
- Introducing a combo ticket available online for daytime and Wild Lights admission
- Host to city employee appreciation event, which attracted more than 1,200 employees and their family members in 2023
