RESOLUTION NO. 2023-181

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2021, the City received its first payment of American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds totaling \$17,360,343.50; and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2021, by Resolution No. 2021-456, the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Operating Budget was amended to establish an American Rescue Plan Fiscal Recovery Special Fund (a grant fund) to account for and track revenues and expenditures associated with the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds to ensure compliance with the terms of the funding; and

WHEREAS, on October 19, 2021, by Resolution No. 2021-763, City Council approved and adopted the American Rescue Plan Funding Plan for the use of the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, which included expending the funding on "job training"; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2022, by Resolution 2022-056, City Council approved electing the "standard allowance" of \$10,000,000.00 to replace its lost revenue and adopted the amended American Rescue Plan Funding Plan for use of the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, which included replacing the city's lost revenue; and

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2022, the City received its second payment of American Rescue Plan Act Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds totaling \$17,360,343.50 for the approved total of \$34,720,687.00; and

WHEREAS, on September 20, 2022, by Resolution 2022-689, City Council approved amending the American Rescue Plan Funding Plan to reallocate funds for housing related projects and utility generators, removing contingency funds, and adding the STEAM Center project; and

WHEREAS, further amendments to the American Rescue Plan Funding Plan are needed to utilize funds for a project that is not in a qualified census tract ("QCT") to support housing opportunities for both low-and-moderate income families,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WACO, TEXAS:

That the City's American Rescue Plan Funding Plan (the "Plan") is hereby amended to reallocate funding from the Responding to Public Health and Economic Impacts of COVID-19 category to the Replacing Lost Public Sector Revenue category (still in support of New Affordable Housing), and is attached hereto as "Exhibit A."

That the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute any documents in connection therewith.

That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this resolution is passed is open to the public as required by law and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by law.
