## What is Genealogy?

- Study of our ancestors
- Determination of family relationships
- Genealogy is the study and tracing of family pedigrees
- Fun!!!

#### Ethics or Standards for Sharing Genealogy


- Only share information about living people if granted permission.
- Fact check information you find online or in other people's research.
- Site your sources. Know where you find information.
- Respect copyright. Do not plagiarize or use information without permission.

## Methodology

- Record what you know. (Known → Unknown)
  - Start with yourself and immediate family.
  - o Work backward one generation at a time; one family line at a time.
  - o Research female ancestors using their MAIDEN name.
- Evaluate/Analyze. (What is missing? Questions?)
- Collect information sources.
  - o Personal/Around the house
  - Other relatives
  - o Published (Secondary Sources)
- What records are available?
- Genealogical Proof Standard (GPS) from BCG Genealogical Standard Manual
  - A reasonably exhaustive search
  - Complete and accurate source citations
  - Analysis and correlation of the collected information
  - Resolution of any conflicting evidence
  - o A Soundly reasoned, coherently written conclusion
- Evaluate/Analyze (What did I learn?)
- Conclusions! Is your conclusion credible?
- DO NOT SKIP GENERATIONS
- Document family knowledge.
  - As you find information, memories will be triggered. Wright down this information as you remember it. Continue the conversation with family to see if they also have new memories.

## Information Gathering

- Relationship Chart
- From around the home
- Relatives known or distant
- Oral history
- Reunion
  - o Put together or attend a family reunion.
  - Contacts will be beneficial in your research
  - o Discovery of unknown family documents, stories, clues
  - Other types of reunions (were your family members part of a group?):
    - Class Reunions
    - Military Reunions
  - Make copies of photos and ask for help identifying names and locations.
- Mail out letter / geographic area
- Advertisement
  - Genealogical Helper (find at the library)
    - Queries, ads
    - Now on MyHeritage (index is free)
  - Message Boards
    - View archived message boards
    - Often find with a Google search for an ancestor's name
    - Access Ancestry's archived message boards for free
  - Facebook Groups
    - Find a group that relates to your area of research
    - Wide range of subject areas (General, Regional, Ethnic, Surname, etc.)
    - Use the search feature to find past posts related to your research.
    - Post your own research questions.
