#### Value of Supplemental Records

- Confirm that the individual you are viewing is your ancestor.
- Fill in gaps for missing vital records.
- Support information found in other records.
- Identify potential names for FAN (Friends/Family, Associates, Neighbors) research.
- Names, Dates, and Places in your timeline.

### Research Strategies

- Always ask yourself what other records might exist? Complete an exhaustive search.
- Evaluate the record.
  - Who was the source/information for the information?
  - Was this information recorded at the time of the event or later?
- Utilize ALL available resources.
  - Online databases and websites
  - Print books, newspapers, original documents
  - Microfilm
- Aim to understand the broader perspective of your ancestors' lives by researching the context in which they lived.
  - Who did they know?
  - What types of records were being created when they lived?
  - What type of institutions (organizations, churches, schools) were they involved with?
