



# Waco 25<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Stakeholder Committee Meeting #2 Draft Recap Document December 11, 2023

### Introduction

The second Waco 25<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Stakeholders Committee Meeting was held December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023, from 10:00am – 12:00pm. For this meeting, about ten stakeholders reviewed two draft vision statements for the corridor and design themes and elements for cultural representation, gateways, street furniture, and street designs. Stakeholders were then asked to edit the vision statements for what should be included or removed and how they felt about the vision statement overall. In addition, the different aesthetic elements presented were voted on for what stakeholders liked or did not like.
