If mom hasn't returned for more than eight hours, the kittens may be orphans. During kitten season, shelters are overrun and don't have adequate

175th Anniversary City of Waco Government (WACO)



City of Waco mayor, commissioners, attorney, secretary, and city manager from 1955.

Waco's story of self-government is a fascinating journey through different models of leadership. For decades, the city council was comprised of 10 to 12 alderman (another world for elected leaders that make decisions for our City). In April 1908, voters sought a new approach, opting for a commission form of government with a mayor and four commissioners.

However, Waco's political landscape continued to evolve with the adoption of a city manager system where elected officials appoint an individual to manage the city's administrative responsibilities. In 1924, the commissioners chose hired the City of Waco's first city manager.

The most significant recent change came in November 1987, when voters overwhelmingly approved a popularly elected mayor Today, Waco thrives under the council-manager form of government, a testament to the City's commitment to continuous improvement and resident participation.

Friendly Reminder! Use Paper Bags for Leaves



Leaves must be placed in paper bags or placed in the green yard waste cart. Solid Waste cannot accept leaves in plastic bags. Bagged leaves are taken to be mulched with the bag. Any plastic would contaminate the yard waste. Paper yard waste bags are available for purchase at retail stores.

Leaves are a great natural resource. Instead of bagging leaves, you could mow them and sprinkle them on your lawn, use them to enrich soil, or in composting.

Always supervise campfires. A stray ember is all it takes for disaster. Douse it completely with water before leaving, and stir the ashes to make sure no hidden embers remain.

Know before you go. Check for local fire restrictions or burn bans before using fireworks or burning yard waste. Even small flames can easily spiral out of control in dry conditions.

Be spark aware! In hot, dry weather, use extreme caution with anything that can spark a ame, including lawnmowers, welding equipment, and even dragging chains along the ground.
