## Waco July 2021 Sales Tax Report

## Background

The sales tax information is provided by the Texas Comptroller monthly. The Comptroller sales tax information is reported 2 months in arrears, and therefore the July report is May actual sales tax figures.

The city collected $\$ 4,031,318$ in the month of May 2021. This amount is another record high collection for the city. This is a $27.15 \%$ increase from May 2020. The running total for the City through July is $\$ 38,681,824$. This figure is $\$ 9,267,206$ or $31.51 \%$ over the budgeted amount.

## Sales Tax Projection

The budget staff initially forecasted sales tax revenues to be $\$ 44.8$ million for FY 2021. However, the record amounts reported in May, June, and July (March, April, and May sales) has increased our year end forecast to 46.6 M . The chart below shows the forecasts moving closer together, which is what is expected as we progress through the year.

The July report (May sales) set another record collection for the City of Waco, at just over 4 million dollars. The forecast is $\$ 10.6$ million more than budgeted this fiscal year and is based on strong spending from pent up demand, increased costs for goods, a lower unemployment rate, as well as stimulus funding which may be further aided later this year by direct child tax credit payments.

If record highs continue, sales tax collection will exceed the forecasted amount.

(i) Correlation is the multiplier used based on what has been collected throughout the year to help generate a forecast.
