Waco is Cleaning Up and Throwing Out

WACO, TEXAS (May 1, 2020) The City of Waco Solid Waste Crews, Cobbs Citizen Convenience Center and the City of Waco Landfill have been extra busy during this time while Waco residents are staying at home. Many are cleaning out their house and getting those projects done that have been put on hold because of no time. Others are taking advantage of the time and weather to tend to their yard, increasing the brush people have.

During March and April of this year, in comparison to 2019, bulky waste residential curbside collection requests have risen from 62 requests in 2019 to 492 in 2020. That's more than a seven-fold increase during the past 2 months when compared to the same time last year.

Waco residents have options to dispose of the bulky items and brush. You can drop it off or call to have it picked up at residential curbside. Residents can pack their items up and head over to the Cobbs Citizen Convenience Center (2021 44th St. between Cobbs Drive and Trice Ave.) or to drop off your bulky items and brush. Residents can also head over to the City of Waco Landfill (1624 Hannah Hill Rd.) to drop off. Drop off at both locations require proof of residency. You can also call (254) 299-2612 and have the bulky items or brush picked up, but remember there are certain restrictions, you can find those on the City of Waco website.
