(July 24, 2020) Dr. Farley Verner, the Local Health Authority for the Waco McLennan County Public Health District has issued a revision to the control measures put in place on July 21, 2020.

There is a need to clarify the July 21, 2020 Order to remain consistent with the Executive Order of Governor Greg Abbott. With the revision, religious schools are exempt from the Order and may start in-person classes before September 7, 2020. Public schools and non-religious private schools must comply with the order.

The revised Order issued under Dr. Verner's authority as the Local Health Authority of Waco-McLennan County Public Health District takes effect July 24, 2020 and is posted on the COVIDWACO.com website.
